“Going Backwards”

Scripture: Hebrews 2:2-3; 3:12-13; 5:11-12; 10:23-25, 30 (NIV)

The Signs of Going Backwards:

I. A lack of _____.

Hebrews 2:2-3 – For since the message spoken through angels was binding, and every violation and disobedience received its just punishment, how shall we escape if we ignore so great a salvation? This salvation, which was first announced by the Lord, was confirmed to us by those who heard him.

When you do not realize what you have, you have a tendency to take it for granted.

Galatians 6:9 – Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.

II. A lack of _____.

Hebrews 3:12-13 – See to it, brothers and sisters, that none of you has a sinful, unbelieving heart that turns away from the living God. But encourage one another daily, as long as it is called “Today,” so that none of you may be hardened by sin’s deceitfulness.

Hebrews 11:25b – ... enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin.

Sin’s deceitfulness will cause you to go backwards in your commitment.

Philippians 2:4 – Not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.

III. A lack of _____.

Hebrews 5:11-12 – We have much to say about this, but it is hard to make it clear to you because you no longer try to understand. In fact, though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you the elementary truths of God’s word all over again. You need milk, not solid food!

Many Christians are no longer thinking the way God is thinking.

1 Peter 2:2-3 – Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, now that you have tasted that the Lord is good.

IV. A lack of _____.

Hebrews 10:23-25, 30 – Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching. ... For we know him who said, “It is mine to avenge; I will repay,” and again, “The Lord will judge his people.”

When you remove yourself from Christian fellowship, you will regress in your faithfulness.
