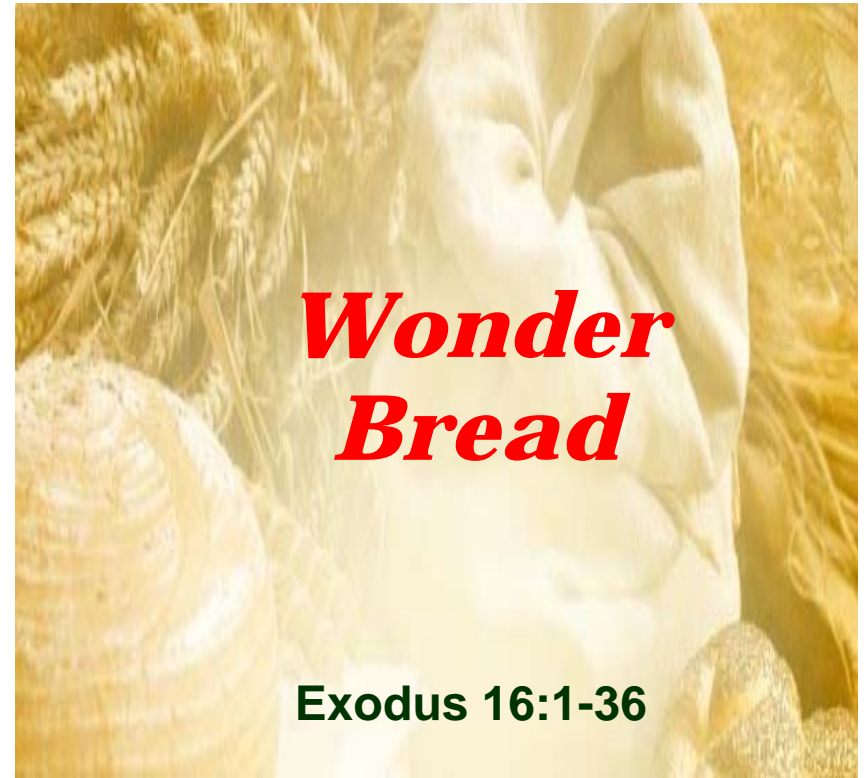

“Wonder Bread”

Scripture: Exodus 16:1-36 (NIV)

God’s Wonder Bread:

I. Is a _____ Bread.

Exodus 16:4 – *Then the Lord said to Moses, “I will rain down bread from heaven for you. The people are to go out each day and gather enough for that day. In this way I will test them and see whether they will follow my instructions.*

The Wonder Bread had two unique qualities:

- It was miraculous.

John 6:33 – *For the bread of God is the bread that comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.*

God sent the manna and God sent His son.

Galatians 4:4 – *But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law,*

- It was mysterious.

Exodus 16:15 – *When the Israelites saw it, they said to each other, “What is it?” For they did not know what it was. Moses said to them, “It is the bread the Lord has given you to eat.*

Manna - means *What is this.*

We accept Jesus by trusting.

Mark 4:41 – *They were terrified and asked each other, “Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!”*

II. Is a _____ Bread.

The Wonder Bread was:

- Spotless (white).

Exodus 16:31a – *The people of Israel called the bread manna. It was white like coriander seed ...*

Matthew 28:3 – *His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow.*

Mark 9:3 – *His clothes became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them.*

Revelation 1:14 – *The hair on his head was white like wool, as white as snow, and his eyes were like blazing fire.*

Jesus is easy to find.

- Sweet (honey).

Exodus 16:31b – *... and tasted like wafers made with honey.*

It is Jesus who adds sweetness to our life.

Acts 3:26 – *When God raised up his servant, he sent him first to you to bless you by turning each of you from your wicked ways.*

- Satisfactory.

Exodus 16:18b – *... Everyone had gathered just as much as they needed.*

Jesus supplies our needs.

Luke 9:17 – *They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over.*

Every day Jesus satisfies us.

Jesus, the bread of life sustains us forever.

John 6:48-50 – *I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, yet they died. But here is the bread that comes down from heaven, which anyone may eat and not die.*

Before we partake in the Lord’s Supper, we need to examine ourselves first.

1 Corinthians 11:27-28 – *So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink from the cup.*
