“A Time to Remember”

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 11:23-25 (NIV)

Synopsis: There are certain stages in life when we pause to remember or reflect upon the past. Jesus had such a moment prior to His crucifixion. He gathered His disciples and shared a special meal with them and made a profound statement, “Do this in remembrance of me.” Today, what should we remember about Jesus?

Remember this about Jesus:

I. How He changed _____.

1 Corinthians 11:23a – For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: ...

Matthew 15:1-3 – Then some Pharisees and teachers of the law came to Jesus from Jerusalem and asked, “Why do your disciples break the tradition of the elders? They don’t wash their hands before they eat!” Jesus replied, “And why do you break the command of God for the sake of your tradition?”

We need to carefully examine our traditions and measure them against God’s Word.

Jesus is a game changer.

II. How He changed _____.

1 Corinthians 11:23b-25 – ... The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and

said, “This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me.” In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, “This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me.”

No one has changed history like Jesus.

It is what Jesus did that changed the world.

John 16:33 – I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.

III. How He changed _____.

1 Corinthians 11:24b & 25b – ... in remembrance of me.

Jesus’ purpose is to seek and save.

Luke 19:10 – For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.

We need to stop playing hide and seek with God.

John 10:10b – ... I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.

Jesus paid the price so that we could live.

Romans 8:1-3a – Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death. For what the law was powerless to do because it was weakened by the flesh, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh to be a sin offering. ...

We do not come to the communion table because we are worthy, but because He is worthy.

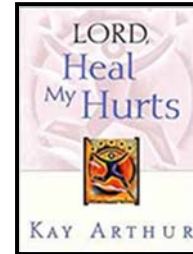
