

The night was heavy with silence. The city of Jerusalem lay still, the air thick with the weight of what had transpired just days before. The tomb, hewn from stone, stood sealed by a great rock, guarded by Roman soldiers whose torches flickered in the cold, early morning air.

Inside, darkness reigned. The body of Jesus had been laid there, wrapped in linen, cold and lifeless. His followers had grieved, their hopes shattered, their faith shaken. The world, it seemed, had won. Death had triumphed.

Yet something unseen stirred in the depths of the earth. A power beyond comprehension surged through the void, racing towards the tomb, pressing against the stone. And then—suddenly—a tremor. At first, it was slight, a whisper through the ground. But then it grew, shaking the earth beneath the soldiers' feet. They staggered, panic flashing in their eyes.

A blinding light erupted from the heavens. The sky itself seemed to break apart. A figure descended, brilliant as the morning sun, radiating an authority that made the very air tremble. The angel, a messenger of the Most High, landed before the sealed grave. With a force beyond human strength, he rolled back the massive stone as if it were nothing more than a pebble.

The Roman guards fell back, terror gripping them. Their weapons were useless, their training meaningless. Faces pale, hearts pounding, they fled into the shadows, unable to comprehend what they had witnessed.

Then—SILENCE.

A breath! A breath from the heart of the tomb and life surged once more. Fingers that had been still, twitched. Eyes that were closed in death, now fluttered open. The body that had known pain, that had been broken, that had lain in death's embrace, now moved. Jesus sat up.

The linen wrappings slipped from His form. Slowly, He stood, stepping into the cool air of the tomb, His eyes reflecting a fire that death itself had failed to extinguish. The world had not won. Death had not triumphed. He stepped forward, out of the grave, the first light of dawn casting golden rays upon Him. The world would never be the same.



On Friday, April 18th at 7 p.m., **USBC** will be having a special *Good Friday Service*. During our time together, we will reflect upon the crucifixion of Christ through song, Scripture, worship video, and communion. The purpose of the *Good Friday Service* is to reflect upon the great sacrifice that Jesus has made for us and to praise His name for conquering death and giving us life.



On April 20th, **USBC** wants you to experience communion in an intimate way. Therefore, on Easter Sunday, you are invited to participate in the taking of communion. Instead of having the Lord's Supper as a congregational event, you will have the opportunity to partake of communion in a personal and private time of reflection.

During the time between 10 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., communion will be set up in the Adult Sunday School classroom. When you arrive at church on Easter morning, please make your way to this designated area to take of the cup and bread. If you are unable to take communion prior to the 11:00 a.m. worship service, you will still have an opportunity to celebrate the Lord's Supper following the service.



On April 6th, immediately following worship service, the church will be putting up Easter decorations to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. If you would like to help with the decorating, you are invited to stay after church for about 15 minutes.



Upper Seneca Baptist Church will be having our *Easter Service* on Sunday, April 20th at 11:00 a.m. During our Easter celebration service, we will sing His praises, we will share His Word, we will proclaim His great name, and we will respond with a faithful heart.




On April 13th, immediately following the Sunday morning worship, **USBC** will be having a children's *Easter Egg Hunt*. Once the service has concluded, the adults will hide Easter eggs, filled with prizes. So, bring a basket so that you can collect your Easter eggs. If the outdoor weather does not cooperate, the *Easter Egg Hunt* will take place indoors.

In April, the sermons will focus on the Easter story. Jesus came to this world to die upon a cross to save sinners from sin. Jesus submitted to the will of His Father and in the process, He died a brutal death. However, through His death, Jesus brought about everlasting life to a dying world.

April 6th

Sermon Title: "Father Forgive Them"

Scripture: Luke 23:34

Synopsis: Three groups of people mocked Jesus while He was hanging on the cross: the religious leaders, the Roman soldiers, and a criminal. Jesus responded by fulfilling His own teachings: turning the other cheek, loving His enemies, praying for those who persecuted Him. The cross reveals God's self-giving love: forgiveness for the oppressors, forgiveness for the mockers, and forgiveness for the wrongdoers.

April 13th

Sermon Title: "The King Has Come"

Scripture: Matthew 21:1-11

Synopsis: Palm Sunday is a celebration of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem as the King of Kings. Yet, it also foreshadows His journey to the cross. The crowd shouted "Hosanna!", but would soon cry "Crucify Him!" Jesus came not to conquer by force, but to save through sacrificial love.

April 20th

Sermon Title: "*Touched*" **Scripture:** Matthew 28:1-10

Synopsis: An encounter with Jesus can change lives and bring about a real transformation. When Jesus rose from the dead, He appeared to His disciples and followers, reassuring them with His presence and power. His resurrection was not just a historical event, but a personal touch for all who believe.

April 27th

Sermon Title: "The Week After Easter"

Scripture: John 20:24-29

Synopsis: The first time Jesus appeared to His disciples; Thomas was not present. Thomas doubted the words of the others. However, Jesus later appeared to Thomas and his doubt was erased and his faith was strengthened. Through our doubt, we too can have our faith strengthened.



Congratulations!! Carlos Navarrete who officially became a United States citizen on March 22nd.


