As we approach July 4th, American patriotism goes into overdrive and understandably so. This July 4th (2023), the United States of America will be celebrating its 247th birthday. During this patriotic celebration, fireworks will be bursting in air, festive parades will be marching in the streets, family cookouts will abound, Lee Greenwood will sing "God Bless the USA", and America flags will proudly wave in the brisk summer breeze.

The American flag is a national symbol that represents our freedom. When one gazes upon the red, white, and blue, it is a somber reminder of the great sacrifice that others have made. Through their faithful commitment and the giving of their life, we can live a life of true freedom and prosperity. So, as we reflect upon the flag, it is a beautiful picture of the freedom that has been afforded to us.

However, there is another flag that is often overlook that also stands for freedom; eternal freedom that came at a great sacrifice. It is not a country flag, it is not a state flag, nor it is a local flag. It is the Christian Flag. To be honest, many Christians are not even aware that there is a Christian Flag that represents our freedom in Christ.

The Christian flag dates back to an impromptu speech given by Charles C. Overton, a Sunday school superintendent in New York, on September 26, 1897. The guest speaker for the Sunday school kick-off didn't show up, so Overton had to wing it. Spying an American flag near the podium, he started talking about flags and their symbolism. Along the way he proposed that Christians should have their own flag—an idea that stayed on his mind long after the speech. In 1907 Overton teamed up with Ralph Diffendorfer, secretary to the Methodist Young People's Missionary Movement, to produce and promote the flag.

The colors on the flag, not surprisingly, match those on the American flag. White represents purity and peace, blue indicates fidelity, and red stands for Christ's blood sacrifice.

So come July 4th, as you witness the display of the American Flag, remember that there is another flag that represents everlasting freedom that no one can take away; the Christian Flag. Yes, the American Flag represents the birth of a nation, but the Christian Flag represents of the birth of eternal life through Jesus Christ. And that my friend, is true freedom.

Romans 8:1-2 – Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death.

If you were not in attendance or have not yet watched this special *Father's Day Service*, please go to the church's website where this service and others can be viewed.





This *Special Communion Observance* will take 30 minutes and it will have a lasting impression on you forever. All are invited to attend this unforgettable communion celebration.


