
Please invite your friends and family to attend our special 219th Anniversary Service. It will be a blessing for all when we join together to worship God on this special occasion.

Between now and the end of the year, you are invited to invest your time and resources by helping with four, very important *Mission Projects*.

- Gabriel Project of Montgomery County (Assist pregnant/young mothers with baby needs—Helping babies have a healthy, safe start in life...).
- <u>USBC Thanksgiving Food Drive</u> (October 27, 2024 thru November 17, 2024).
- <u>Samaritan's Purse</u> (Operation Christmas Child delivers great joy and the Good News of Jesus Christ to children in need around the world through gift-filled shoeboxes. Each box packed full of quality toys, school supplies, and personal care items becomes a tangible expression of God's immense love for the child. For many, it is their first gift ever! Delivered by our local church partners, shoebox gifts provide an opportunity to present the Gospel to boys and girls in a clear, child-friendly way. National Collection Week is November 18–25, 2024.).
- <u>Blessing Bags</u> (*Blessing Bags* are bags that contain necessities, toiletries, food, and some extras that you can keep with you to hand out when you come across an individual grappling with poverty. This is a concrete way to help when you feel the desire to do something, but don't know what that looks like. These kits can help meet their immediate needs, as well as showing that they are seen and they are worthy.)

Oct. 6th

Sermon Title: "Which Soil Am I in?" Scripture: Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23

Synopsis: Jesus shared clearly in the parable of the soils that there is only one soil you want to be on. As Jesus followers, we want to be on the fruitful and good soil but honestly, we better identify with the thorns. We will look at how this isn't just a "next best" option for life, but rather that the two soils are the difference between death and life for you and generations to come.

Sermon Title: "Bloody Ankles"
Scripture: Acts 26:14-18

Synopsis: As a Christian it is easy to get off course. However, God has a way of getting our attention and putting us back on the right path. Symbolically, God used a goad to correct Paul's life. A goad is a sharp stick used to prod the animal in the right direction. If you kick hard enough against the goad, it can draw blood. Today, we also kick against the will of God and we have the scars to prove it.

Special Service: "There's Joy in the House"

Scripture: Psalm 122:1

Synopsis: There is a sense of joy and excitement that fills our hearts when we enter the house of the Lord. This joy is not just a fleeting emotion, but a deep and abiding sense of gratefulness and fulfillment that comes from being in God's presence.


Oct. 27th



USBC is in the process of creating a **new website** for the church. If you have any suggestions, as to what would improve the website or what would make it more engaging, please see Nigel Hendricks.






