Sermon Title: "Focused On Today"
Scripture: Matthew 6:11 & 34

Synopsis: When we stay fully present in today, we're able to hear God clearly, recognize His blessings, and respond to the opportunities and needs in front of us. Far too often, our minds are living in next week, next year, or a future we've imagined in fear. But Jesus continues to redirect our focus back to the present, where His grace is active and sufficient.

Sermon Title: "You're Not Alone"

Scripture: John 16:33

Synopsis: This truth is crucial in times of fear, grief, or uncertainty. You are never alone. The Savior who conquered death is present in your struggles, offering peace the world cannot give and strength the world cannot match. His promise is not to remove every hardship but to remain with you through it all—guiding, comforting, and strengthening you until the very end.
